Chest Clinics

What is a Chest Clinic?

These are clinics provided by NSW health to carry out the following services:

- Assessment and diagnosis of Tuberculosis
- Treatment and management of Tuberculosis
- Health undertakings
 - Assessment, screening, follow-up, monitoring and education of people on Tuberculosis Health Undertakings (TBU). TBUs are issued by the Department of Immigration & Citizenship on persons entering Australia with chest x-ray assessments that need follow-up.
- Refugee screening
- Administration of BCG vaccination
- Education and counselling services
- General advice.
